Our theme this year is: **Crown your mind with confidence and the world will see your sparkle!**

If crowned Little or Junior Miss Cass County, you will have the opportunity to participate in many fun activities alongside the 2025 Miss Cass County Queen and her court. Such activities include numerous appearances at the 2025 4-H Fair serving as a young ambassador for the Cass County Fair festivities, radio advertisements and interviews, parades and much more throughout the year.

Little Miss Cass County

Purpose of Program:

- To give young girls an outlet this summer to grow internally as a young lady by helping them realize their self-worth and discover their inner beauty.
- To offer young ladies a role of responsibility and community involvement at a younger age.

Little Miss Cass County (LMCC) Requirements:

- Each contestant must be a biological female, and must be 7-10 years old as of July 5, 2025 (if you turn 11 on or before July 5th, you must run for Junior Miss).
- Must have been a resident of Cass County or attending a Cass County school since January 1, 2025.
- LMCC contestants will attend as many workshops as they can throughout the months of May July. There is no penalty for missing these workshops (we understand sporting events, vacations, etc. come up during the summer); however, keep in mind, the girls are voting for half of the category awards they earn points for in order to win the overall LMCC title so not attending could affect your daughter's chance for getting to know the other contestants. There is much more to this program than winning the overall title, so if she can only make it to 2-3 workshops due to scheduling conflicts then she will still gain other skill sets to help develop her into a stronger, more confident, young lady.
- In order to earn points going towards her overall point total, LMCC contestants are encouraged to get a Community Sponsor(s) to donate <u>\$50</u>. This is **DUE Saturday**, **May 17**th at the first workshop.
- A large aspect of our program is teaching the girls the meaning of Community Service. Your daughter will be responsible for making a Community Service Poster Presentation. No items or monetary donations will be collected by the Little, Junior, and Teen Miss Cass County Committee. Each participant will be responsible for creating a poster board (no larger than 24"X36") presenting a community service project they participated in during or after January 2023 up to the date of presentations. We will be holding a community service day for the girls to participate in, and they are welcome to do their project over the opportunity we provide. They can also create a project of their own if they choose. Presentations will be no longer than 4 minutes each. The posters will be presented to a group of 3 non-biased judges (from outside of Cass County) and points will be awarded accordingly based on the 1st-5th place point system outlined on the Point System and Awards page of this application. Presentations will take place at the Cass County 4-H Fairground Community Building on Wednesday, June 25th, 2025, from 4 pm-8 pm.

Judging of the posters and presentations will be based on the following criteria:

- 20pts. Understanding of Community Service.
- 20pts. Lessons learned through the process of participation in the project.
- 20pts. Understanding of impact on the community.
- 5pts. Creativity and presentation of the poster.

Example Community Service Projects: Collecting donations for a charity, picking up trash at a trail/park/outdoor space, helping an elderly neighbor carrying groceries/pulling weeds/etc., Donating clothes/toys, Volunteering at a Special Olympics event, or another charitable event.

Little Miss Cass County (LMCC) Role:

If elected Little Miss Cass County, her duties will include:

- LMCC will wear her tiara and sash and be introduced alongside the 2025 Miss Cass County Queen and her court at any fair activities she and her chaperon choose to participate in. A weekly itinerary for the 4-H fair week will be given immediately following being crowned.
- LMCC must be accompanied by her parent or guardian at all 4-H Fair events and outside activities (parades, open shows, etc) she participates in throughout the year.
- Being a positive role model and example to other young girls in the community. We challenge you to make the most of your reign to positively impact another young girl's life, while working on yourself and making sure you have confidence, poise, and self-esteem while reigning.

Junior Miss Cass County

Purpose of Program:

- To give young girls an outlet this summer to grow internally as a young lady by helping them realize their self-worth and discover their inner beauty.
- To offer young ladies a role of responsibility and community involvement at a younger age.

Junior Miss Cass County (JMCC) Requirements:

- Each contestant must be a biological female, and must be 11-14 years old as of July 5, 2025 (if you turn 15 on or before July 5^{th} , you must run for Teen Miss).
- Must have been a resident of Cass County or attending a Cass County school since January 1, 2025.
- JMCC contestants will attend as many workshops as they can throughout the months of May July. There is no penalty for missing these workshops (we understand sporting events, vacations, etc. come up during the summer); however, keep in mind, the girls are voting for half of the category awards they earn points for in order to win the overall JMCC title so not attending could affect your daughter's chance for getting to know the other contestants. There is much more to this program than winning the overall title, so if she can only make it to 2-3 workshops due to scheduling conflicts then she will still gain other skill sets to help develop her into a stronger, more confident, young lady.
- In order to earn points going towards her overall point total, JMCC contestants are encouraged to get a Community Sponsor(s) to donate \$75. This is **DUE Saturday**, **May 17**th at the first workshop.
